October is Breast Cancer Awareness Month

Cancer is scary. We can all agree with that. Nearly 250,000 women and men will be diagnosed this year in the US with breast cancer.

Sometimes it gets its butt kicked! Other times sadly, it wins. It affects so many people, both directly and indirectly and it's just not fair. Most of us have some connection and experience with this horrible disease. So let's promote Breast Cancer Awareness this month.

The first organized effort to bring widespread attention to breast cancer occurred as a weeklong event in the United States in October 1985. Since then, campaigns to increase awareness of the disease, to educate people about methods of prevention and early detection, and to raise money to support research have extended to countries around the world. Today, nonprofit organizations, government agencies, and medical societies work together to promote breast cancer awareness.

Throughout Breast Cancer Awareness Month, science forums, educational programs, and informational pamphlets and posters are used as means to disseminate information to the public. A number of special events are held as well, including National Mammogram Day in the United States, which focuses on the importance of screening and early detection of breast cancer. In addition, fund-raising activities, such as walks, runs, auctions, concerts, and other charity events, are held in countries around the world. The money collected by these events typically goes toward local, national, or international funding for breast cancer research. Scientific conferences and meetings of international cancer organizations also may be scheduled in conjunction with awareness campaigns.

The major international symbol of Breast Cancer Awareness Month is the color pink. In the 1990s the pink ribbon stood as the primary emblem of support.

October is Fire Safety Month

October 4-10 is Fire Prevention Week (FPW). This annual public service announcement and education week is sponsored by the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) and has been endorsed by every US President since Calvin Coolidge in 1925.

This annual event is held in memory of the Great Chicago Fire of October 8th, 1871. This commemoration reminds us of the dangers of fire and how we must resolve to be vigilant in our fire safety practices.

Fort Lee Fire and Emergency Services wishes to remind everyone of the dangers of unattended cooking. According to the NFPA, unattended cooking is the number one cause of structure fires in the United States. This year's fire safety message is "Cook with Care! Serve up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!"

Please take a few moments and review with your family some proper fire safety practices.

- Never play with fire.
- Keep your cooking grills away from the side of your house.
- Do not leave burning candles unattended.
- Practice fire drills in your home with your family.
- Test your smoke alarms once a month!
