




BACK TO SCHOOL

Hunt Military Communities Foundation (HMCF) and Operation Homefront are excited to collaborate again to bring school supplies to military children before the 2023-2024 school year. This year, HMCF secured 2,314 backpacks filled with school supplies and will be distributing them throughout August to HMC communities within the continental U.S. and Hawaii.

Each year, Active Duty Service Member school-age children between the ages of who reside in Hunt Military Communities homes are eligible to register for a backpack. This program, in its third year, aims to alleviate some of the financial burden military families face when getting their children ready for school by providing backpacks with a variety of needed supplies, including pens, pencils, paper, scissors, and binders all tailored to the needs and grade levels of the children.

COMMUNITY ANNOUNCEMENTS

Gregg-Adams Family Housing has noticed an unusual abundance of pool violations.

As stated in your Resident Handbook, personally owned pools are limited to small wading pools, not to exceed 18 inches in depth and 8 feet in diameter. Residents will ensure that an adult closely supervises children utilizing the pools and pools are emptied when not in use. For health and safety reasons, it is recommended that chlorine tablets be added to the water in pools. Any damage to grass areas will be repaired at resident's expense.

Pools must be emptied and properly stored immediately after use and may not remain filled overnight.

MAINTENANCE CORNER

What Should You Do Before a Hurricane? Make plans to stay safe.

Determine your best protection from high winds and flooding. Have a plan to evacuate and a plan to shelter safely. Take time now to gather the supplies and knowledge you will need when the storm arrives.

Fortunately for us, Fort Gregg-Adams is relatively low on the Hurricane Risk list. In the event we do experience a hurricane, have your plan to evacuate. If advised to evacuate, do so immediately and go to a safe place.

- Know where you will go, how you will get there, and where you will stay.
- Plan well in advance if you will need help leaving.
- Mobile/manufactured/trailer homes and recreational vehicles (RVs) cannot provide safe shelter from tropical storms or hurricane force winds.
- Be ready to go without power, water, gas, phone and Internet for a while.
- Practice going to a designated safe shelter for high winds. The next best protection is a small, interior, windowless room in a sturdy building on the lowest level that is not likely to flood.
- If you live in an area that is likely to flood, designate a location on higher ground that you can move to before floodwaters reach you.

Gather emergency supplies, food, water, and medicine. Stores and pharmacies might be closed. Organize supplies into a Go-Kit and a Stay-at-Home Kit. Go-Kit: at least three days of supplies that you can carry with you. Include backup batteries and chargers for your devices (cell phone, CPAP, wheelchair, etc.) Stay-at-Home Kit: at least two weeks of supplies. Have a 1-month supply of medication in a child-proof container and medical supplies or equipment. Keep personal, financial, and medical records safe and easy to access (hard copies or securely backed up). Consider keeping a list of your medications and dosages on a small card to carry with you.

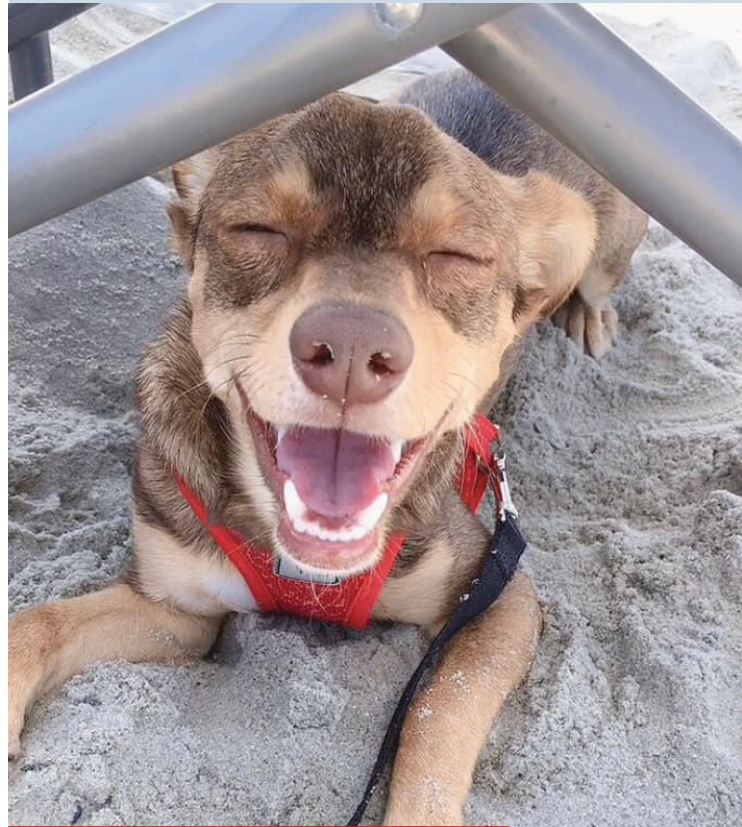
What to Do: If local authorities advise you to evacuate, go right away. Bring your Go-Kit. Follow evacuation routes and do not try to take shortcuts because they may be blocked. Check with local officials for shelter locations. You may want to download the Red Cross Emergency App to find shelters near you. Determine your best protection for high winds and flooding. Take shelter in a designated storm shelter or an interior room for high winds. Stay away from glass windows and doors. Move to higher ground before flooding begins. Never walk, swim, or drive through floodwater. Remember, Turn Around! Don't Drown!
