## Grill Cleaning & Maintenance Tips

There's a lot of grilling weather ahead of us. Here are a few tips:

- Clean flame tamers using a wire brush to remove debris
- Brush grates routinely with a dry wire grill brush with the burners turned off.

For charcoal grills, sprinkle water on grill brush to steam clean the hot grate.

- Inspect fuel lines on gas grills. Brush soapy water along connections. If

bubbles form when gas is turned on, tighten connections or replace lines.

- Clean lids with dishwashing liquid and water. Dry with paper towels.

- Keep kids and pets away from grills. Adult supervision required!
- Store LP tanks upright in a secure area, not in vehicles.
- Ensure lid is OPEN when lighting a gas grill.



## Safety Reminders for the Summer's

Summer's here! Here are a few maintenance and safety reminders:

Give your air conditioner a test run to ensure it's operating properly. Don't wait until the first scorching day! Please initiate a maintenance request if needed. Let Mother Nature cool your home - open windows on cool mornings and evenings, close windows and shades during the heat of the day.

Ensure grills are attended by an adult when in use. Keep grills away from homes, fences, other structures, overhangs and trees. Have a hose or fire extinguisher within reach.
