The annual CEL Survey is an important instrument for Hunt to understand what we are doing well and what we need to work to improve. The CEL survey is available to all military housing residents throughout the country. It is controlled and administered by an independent,

third-party who reports the results simultaneously to us and the Department of Defense. Across the Hunt portfolio of communities, we have an average of over 50% of our residents who respond. This response rate is statistically high, but we want to continue to encourage our residents to respond in as large numbers as possible, so we get an accurate view of what is occurring within the communities. Our goal is 100% satisfaction. When we fall short, we want to know so we can fix any problems before they become bigger issues. We also want to know which of our communities have high satisfaction rates so we can share best practices.

Newsletter Tips

General cleaning and housekeeping is instrumental in maintaining good indoor air quality and minimizing the potential for microbial growth. Mold spores can easily collect in settled dust indoors, as well as a variety of other surfaces and mediums. When combined with adequate moisture and a viable food source, these spores can begin to colonize or reproduce. Below are some guidelines for good housekeeping and general cleaning:

Routine dusting of flat surfaces in the home, dusting of any return or exhaust ventilation grilles, and regular vacuuming of carpets. Routine cleaning of bathrooms to include specifically sinks, inside of bathtubs/shower stalls, and toilets.

Running exhaust ventilation during and after showering to limit condensation forming on walls and ceilings.

Cleaning up water spillage on bathroom floors generated by bathing or showering.

Additionally, an important aspect of maintaining good indoor air quality is a properly functioning HVAC system. Some practices that would not allow the HVAC system to function properly and have a negative impact on indoor air quality include:

Running the air conditioning with doors or windows left open. This will lead to decreased efficiency of the unit, uncontrolled ambient air temperature and humidity levels, and probable condensation triggers leading to potential microbial growth.

Occupying unconditioned spaces in the home such as garages. Since garages are not conditioned spaces, the temperature and humidity cannot be adequately regulated. Additionally, these spaces do not have filtered supplied air so many outdoor contaminants such as mold spores, pollen, and other debris are prevalent in the air. These can mix with the indoor environment by leaving garage doors open while occupying these spaces.
